One of the most used requests in the ISSS Portal is the Reprint/ Revised/ Travel Signature I-20. It is mostly used for those who need a Travel Signature in page 2 to travel internationally.

Signature I-20

This Travel Signature is valid for one year. To complete this request, you need to Reprint/Revised/Travel state the reason for traveling (vacation, break, family emergency, visa renewal, etc.) and provide a copy of passport and visa to check their validity

## the tip of this month



It is very common for non-Americans to make mistakes and provide a non valid address when filling out a form. This can generate a problem for you since SEVIS only accept verified addresses; and it is a bigger issue when work authorization cards get lost in the mail because of a wrong or non-valid address.

You should learn the format of addresses in the US is Line 1, Line 2, City, State and Zip code. No building complex names, no near of or next to is necessary.

You should always run the address you want to use by the United States Postal Services website <u>www.usps.com</u>, They have a tool to **Look Up Zip Code by Address**, where you can verify it or find suggestion to the right address.

Try it now to best learn the US address format.
