

Sometimes it is confusing when you try to get your **Most Recent I-94** and the record shows a previous entry, not the last one. You may think it is a mistake, because when pulling your travel history, it shows that your last entry was recorded.

Try this instead:

- 1. Change the passport number for your SEVIS number.
- Try entering your full name as it appears in your passport
- 3. Try omitting one of your first names or last names, all combinations as possible.

If after all this, you still can't get the most recent record. Contact your International Student Advisor for instructions on what else to do.
